

LSB 278

- In Holy Baptism Alvin was clothed with the robe of Christ's righteousness that covered all his sin. St. Paul says: "Do you not know that all of us who have been baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into His death?"
- We were buried therefore with Him by baptism into death, in order that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, we too might walk in newness of life. For if we have been united with Him in a death like His, we shall certainly be united with Him in a resurrection like His.



Sermon

God's Grace to Al Davis

Alvin Ray ("Al") Davis, aged 62, entered eternal life on June 24, 2023. Al was born in Paw Paw, Michigan on February 18, 1961, the son of Melvin and Beverly Davis. On October 17, 1981 he married Renee Feigel; on December 5, 1982, he was united to the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ in Holy Baptism and confirmed at St. John's Lutheran Church in Mount Prospect, Illinois. The Davis family became members of Messiah Lutheran Church on September 6, 2001.

Al was active in worship and fellowship at Messiah; he served on the Board of Trustees, frequently helping with outdoor work around the church. He also volunteered as a cook for events like our Advent and Lent Prayer Breakfasts and our Lenten Fish Fry.

Surviving are Al's wife, Renee Davis; his sons, Theo Davis and CJ (Sarah Deacon) Davis; his father, Melvin Davis; his brothers, JR Davis and Tommy Davis; his brother-in-law, Greg (Kyung-ran) Feigel; his sister-in-law, Peggy Korzen; and his mother-in-law, Alice Feigel. Al was preceded in death by: his mother, Beverly Davis; and his brother, Doug Davis.


